I have performed these Suites in troubled spots around the world: over a 1000 performances in Afghanistan, Iraq, Palestine, Uganda, South Africa, Bolivia and U.S. prisons and youth detention centers. Now I want to share them all together in one celebration with you.

And that's not all. Macdara Woods, the great Irish poet and my dear friend, passed away this year. I would like to celebrate his life as well with the cycle of poems, *The Cello Suites*, that he wrote for me, which he recited many times with my performances. Fortunately, he made a recording of them shortly before he died so that the wonderful pairing of his poems and Bach's Suites on Bass can continue.

I hope you save-the-date and join me in this celebratory concert!

I was invited to play Bach's Six Suites at the North Carolina Bach Festival on March 2nd and 4th of 2018: First I performed at beautiful church in Raleigh where I had reunions with many Oberlin friends in the area as well as my bass student Samer from Baghdad who has emigrated to the US. Then I did a nice interview on WUNC The State of Things with Frank Stasio, who used to be at NPR in Washington. And finally I played at the very unique setting for a concert: The Lager House Brewery and Pub in Greenville. A very appreciative audience heard the Suites and enjoyed the beer.

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# Iraq Concert Tour 13 Concerts ~ December 2017

My trip to Iraq was almost the trip that never happened. I was all set to leave in the beginning of October when 90% of the Kurds in Iraq voted for independence in a non-binding referendum. My friends later told me this was idiocy because all it did was enrage the central government in

Baghdad who immediately cancelled all flights to the Kurdish sector, including mine. My friends told me that it was still possible to take the once daily flight from Baghdad to Sulymaniyah in Kurdistan but this would entail getting a visa. According to the website of the Iraqi Embassy in Washington, we believed it would take 15 days to receive the visa, so we booked a flight to Baghdad for three weeks later. After many attempts to learn the status of the visa, we were told that that was only for business visas. We rebooked another flight for December. On the day before my flight and no visa, Sarah got someone on the phone who said that the visa was ready but that we owed \$40 in cash (they no longer accepted money orders). A loyal friend in Washington, Mary Kay Zuravleff, went to the Embassy with the cash in hand and grabbed the visa and overnighted it to me. I made my evening flight. Unfortunately, unbeknownst to me the Turkish government had cancelled all visas to Turkey for Americans because of a dispute over a cleric with President Trump. I arrived in Istanbul at 4:00

in the afternoon and flew to Baghdad at 4:40 the next morning, 12 hours plus unable to get to a hotel in Istanbul. Then in Baghdad, I waited another 10 1/2 hours to eventually arrive in Sulymaniyah at 9:00 in the evening two days later. It was worse on the way back as I had 5 hours in Baghdad but 21 hours in Istanbul which passed in a haze because I had a raging fever and a lung infection.

But enough about that. I didn't miss a single concert. My friends Bashdar and Mustafa Ali kept me busy and fulfilled for two weeks. I performed in elementary schools where children have wonderful reactions to the music. Preschool children sit quietly and listen to Bach and love to feel the vibrations of the bass. Before one concert, a 6th grade class sang me a song about my last visit 2 years ago, "A man with a

beard who made us laugh and Dobbs was his name oh." One elementary school boy commented, "Your music is my heart." After a concert at the Margaret School, named for a martyr who fought for the



Peshmerga in the 60s, a teacher commented that she felt she was sitting by a river listening to the water. I visited the family in Ranya who has adopted me and all in all it was a great trip. OK. Minus the waits and the fever.

#### New Hampshire Prisons 14 Concerts - August-October 2017

The tour began in Friendship House, a rehabilitation center where one young man said my musical story felt to him like "watching a movie." In Sullivan County, I saw a few old friends and the wonderful staff and played the 6th Suite for them; a first in any prison setting. To the surprise of the staff at the Dover Children's Home, 5 out of the 6 kids present first peeked in the room and finally came in and enjoyed the performance. At the Sununu Youth Facility, one girl quoted my story "Shoes" from last year, "They're black, I want 'em back." She asked about my son Scotty and then confided that she was getting out on November 3rd. I wished her luck. They all enjoyed the different stories that I told this year.

In Cheshire County and Valley street jails there were men who told me they were moved by the Bach and were now interested in going to concerts even though they had thought they wouldn't be.

Expanding the program, my first visit to a Federal Prison was a great success presenting 3 concerts. The warden came for a concert and made sure I stopped by to thank me before I left. They asked repeatedly if I would come back. But the nicest moment was when


one of the men told me that he had heard me at Strafford County last year and was so moved that he wrote me a letter and gave it to the Lieutenant at Strafford for me (unfortunately I never received it). When he heard about this concert, he couldn't believe it was me and waited to see the picture on my flyer. Afterwards, he told me that he felt really lucky to have had the experience of hearing me twice. I suggested that he begin going to concerts when he got out and he said he would.

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
